Q: How do you successfully ask for a raise?

A: We all want to be paid fairly and equally compared to our peers. At some point, it's likely that you won't feel that way. Maybe you didn't know what kind of salary to ask for when you were first starting out or you just don't feel like you've been moving up the pay scale like your coworkers. First, I would recommend asking yourself why you feel like you deserve one. If you can't explain it to yourself, you won't be able to convince your supervisor. Here are some things to consider: What are your recent accomplishments? Have your responsibilities or workload increased? What is your salary like compared to your coworkers?

That last question can be a bit harder to answer than the first two. If you feel comfortable, you can just ask your coworkers what they make. If you work in a company where you bill your time for each project that you work on, you may be able to see your coworkers' hourly pay by reviewing billed labor reports. There are also resources on the internet where you can research what the typical salary is for someone in your position. When comparing salaries, it is important to know what your coworkers' responsibilities are compared to yours – try to compare to someone who has similar responsibilities to yours.

Go into the raise discussion with an argument built on facts. Simply saying that you feel you deserve a raise isn't going to get it for you – you need to be able to prove why. Have a specific salary in mind – if you don't, you very likely won't be happy with what you get. But make sure that you are being realistic with your ask – does the salary you are asking for make sense for your position? Figure out the salary that you want and then the one that you would be satisfied with. It might not be possible for your company to give you your goal salary, so be prepared to negotiate and have that second number that you would be satisfied with in mind (keep that number to yourself though – get as much as you can!)

I hope this gives you the tools to ask for a raise with confidence. Now go out there, and get that well-deserved raise!
